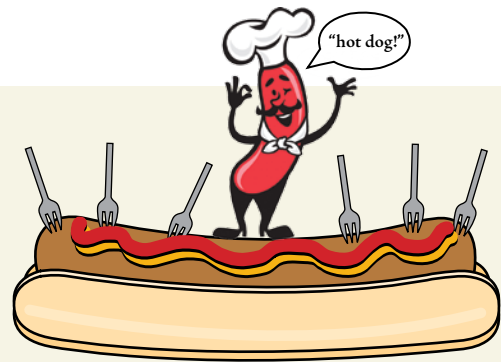
12th Annual World's Longest Weenie Roast at Lakewoods Resort

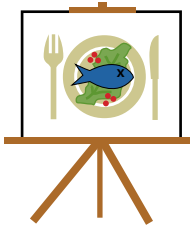
